We were again able to hold the traditional Blythburgh Day 12^{th} -century service in the ruins of the Priory in the village, and host the Horticultural Society summer show in the church. Our annual service for the blessing of animals was a great joy, as ever. It was attended by 116 humans, 60 dogs, three horses, two cats, one rabbit and a toy yak, and toy whale!

The Friends' grant for the new nave altar

We welcomed the Rt Revd Dr Mike Harrison, Bishop of Dunwich to Blythburgh Church on Sunday 9 June to dedicate our magnificent new nave altar table. Since Covid, we've held all our communion services in the main body (nave) of the church but didn't have a dedicated altar table to serve from. But now we do, and it's a thing of beauty! It was designed specifically for the space by member of the Friends and of



our congregation, Charles Morris. The grant from the Friends, together with a generous gift from John, Ann and Laura O'Brien in memory of Richard Parish, made this possible. The table is constructed from seasoned oak donated by Sir John White. Symbolic details have been included using 3,000year-old bog oak provided by cabinet maker Philip Baldwin. The table was constructed thanks to the craftsmanship of Sean Featherstone of Woodland Joinery.
